# DVBC Missions trip to Rocky Point Nov 13-16, 2025

**PURPOSE**: This DVBC short-term missions trip is being planned in cooperation with <u>i6eight</u>. Our purpose is to glorify God by Living for Him, Loving His People and Building His Kingdom. We will be building a 22' x 26' home including bathroom for a needy family in Rocky Point.



**QUALIFICATIONS**: This trip is open to people of all ages. Children and minors are welcome when accompanied by a parent or authorized adult. **Registrations will be open only to DVBC congregants until Aug 31, then open to all others.** A maximum of 65 men, women and children will be accepted, with a waiting list if more than 65 applications are received.

**REQUIREMENTS**: Bring a heart willing to serve and learn.

**TRAVEL INFO**: For those who want to caravan, we will leave the church at noon on Thursday, November 13. Eat early or pack a lunch to eat while driving. It takes about 5 hours to drive to Rocky Point from the church. Buy Mexico car insurance ahead of time so we don't have to wait for you to purchase it while on the trip. Be sure to take your current vehicle registration with you. Those traveling separately need to plan to arrive at the i6eight compound by 5:30 PM. Dinner will not be provided on Thursday. Departure time to return back to Phoenix is around noon on Sunday. If you want to caravan on the return trip, please make your own arrangements.

**PASSPORTS RECOMMENDED**: It is best for each person to have a passport. It is currently taking around 4 to 6 weeks to get a passport. Enhanced driver's licenses will also work. Children under 16 can get by with a birth certificate, but why not get them a passport?

**COST**: The cost is \$300 per adult or youth, with a maximum of \$900 per household. Children under 11 are free. **A \$100 deposit per household is due by Aug 31. Full payment is due to DVBC by October 15**. The overall team cost is about \$16,000. Most of the funds go to buy building materials for the home we are building. Contact Team Leaders Miles or Austin (see below) for ideas on raising funds or to request scholarship assistance! DVBC Elder Paul Weber is willing to provide training on raising a team to help support you in prayer and finances. support team.

**TOOLS**: All the tools needed will be provided, but if you have any favorite hand tools, you may bring them. Just be sure to keep track of them! There will probably not be a place to charge electric tools at the job site.

**ACCOMODATIONS**: We will be roughing it at by camping at the i6eight compound. Bring a tent and sleeping bags. RVs are also permitted but will have no hookups. There are bathrooms and showers at the compound. If you do not have a tent, we can help with that. Meals are provided, but if you have allergies or special dietary requirements, please bring your own food.

### **Travel Documents (PRIORITY)**

• It is best for all participants to have a valid US passport which you must bring with you (or it does you no good). However, enhanced drivers licenses (with a yellow star) will also work. Kids under 18 can use birth certificates.

### **Spending Money**

• \$20 to \$40

## **Building Attire: Recommended**

- Work shoes/boots (NO open toes on work sites to avoid injuries)
- Work gloves
- Work clothes that may get ruined
- NO dresses, Capri's, Tank Tops or Shorts, as this is Cultural...please respect this.

### Personal

- Tent and/or R.V.
- Sleeping bag, blanket, pillow
- Foam mattress, air mattress or sleeping pad recommended
- Clothes that will get dirty and possibly ruined if used at the work site. Short pants are okay in camp, but not at the work site.
- Hat, bandana, sunglasses, sunscreen (SPF 30+, waterproof), lip balm, bug spray
- Closed toe shoes, jeans, t-shirts, sweatshirts mornings and evenings can be chilly in November
- Personal items, including towel, washcloth, soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrush/paste, hand wipes/hand gel; etc.
- Bathing suit, sandals/shower shoes, covering (shower)
- Reusable water bottle
- Flashlight
- Bible & Journal, pen
- Camp chair
- Camera
- Rain gear (weather dependent)
- Vehicle registration and Mexico vehicle insurance (if driving)
