

CAMP SPEAKER: MARTY CALDWELL

Marty Caldwell grew up in Riverside, CA, but met Christ in Young Life in 1969 in Arizona. He led YL at Washington High in Phoenix as a volunteer leader from 1972 through 1978 and started on the Young Life staff in 1978. Marty became the Regional Director for Arizona in 1988. He has been a catalyst for the team, the vision, and the building of Lost Canyon, Young Life's camp in northern AZ, for the last 20 years. On March 1, 2006, Marty was appointed Sr. Vice President of Young Life in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. On October 1, 2015, he was appointed Executive Vice President of Young Life's International work in 104 countries. In October 2019, Marty was tasked with leading the YL Foundation to accelerate present resources and ensure the future health and growth of YL. On August 1, 2024, he was appointed interim Sr. Vice President for the MEA division.

Marty loves his family, Jesus, golf, fishing, and reading. He graduated from Grand Canyon University in 1976. He has a Master's Degree in Counseling from Arizona State University ('80) and an M.A. in Theology from Fuller Theological Seminary ('91).
