Youth Ministry Cell Phone Policy

For this Summer Camp with CIY, we are allowing students to have their phones during the day, **but collecting their phones at night**. NAU is a college campus, and we want to prioritize their safety by having their phones to contact us and connect. We love seeing the photos and videos students take! We are gathering phones at night to prioritize students' sleep, removing distractions and temptations that will prevent them from staying up late. Summer camps are busy and have a long schedule for time with the Lord and our group. CIY provides the map of the campus, the schedule, and the small group curriculum on a separate app for leaders, so having access to that is necessary. If your student does not have a phone, that is ok! We are working with CIY to have some of this information printed out for students, and their leader will be able to provide the information required for the week. This year, we recommend packing a battery-powered, or plug-powered alarm clock to help wake up on time for our days at camp.

With all of this being said, we want students to think about limiting their distractions while at camp. Camp is an investment, and the last thing we want is for the distraction of their cell phone to take them away from hearing the Lord and building friendships with others here. If our leaders see that phones are causing too much of a distraction, they can be confiscated for the remainder of the day. If you do not want your student to have their cell phone, please let Nick know so that we can plan accordingly while we are there to provide the necessary information.

Youth Ministry Drug Policy

Youth Ministry Cell Phone Policy

The purpose of this **policy**: Our desire for our trips is for students to disconnect from their daily rhythms to deepen relationship with the Lord and students and leaders of HSM.

This policy is designed to encourage your student to build community while at camps, mission trips and other events without the distraction that social media and other notifications bring. Our heart is for your student to make deep friendships while deepening their relationship with the Lord. We believe that a change in place and a change in pace can lead to personal transformation as we aim to remove potential distractions.

Parents, our desire is to partner with you in the investment you are making to send your student on a ministry trip with us. We understand the need to be in contact with your child so we are updating this policy for these purposes.

For this purpose of this policy, a cell phone is defined as any handled electronic device that can receive and transmit voice, text, or data messages.

Students will be able to have their phones during transportation to and from ministry trips. We may have variables come up in transportation that we want your student to be able to communicate anything necessary. Upon arrival at camp, students are required to **leave their phones in their cabins/rooms the remainder of the trip unless we have an off-campus activity planned**. For communication, alarms, and connection reasons, we want students to be able to communicate with you if needed.

If the Junior High, High School, or an adult volunteer sees a phone from one of our students that is outside of their room, then we ask you give each leader permission to take their phone and return it to them or the leader to leave in their room. Upon returning their phone, we will discuss boundaries with their phone. If this continues to be a problem, the Student Ministry Director will keep their phone until transportation home.

Students will be encouraged to bring their cameras apart from their cell phones. Their leaders will be taking photographs during the duration of the camp. Phone numbers of the Leaders and Directors will be provided beforehand if the need to contact a child should occur. Likewise, if students are required to get home, they will have access to their Leader's cell phones with permission.

The cell phone policy will be in effect as of June 2023
